This week a whistleblower revealed information that contradicts your recent testimony before the House Judiciary Committee.

Please answer the following questions and provide the requested information by December 3, 2021.

1. How many meetings have Department of Justice personnel held with federal, state, local, Tribal, and territorial leaders pursuant to your October 4, 2021, memorandum?
2. Where were those meetings held?
3. Who participated in those meetings?
4. Has a task force been established?
5. If a task force has been established:
 - a. How many meetings has the task force held?
 - b. Who are the members of the task force?
6. What steps has the National Security Division taken to implement your memorandum?
7. What steps has the FBI Counterterrorism Division taken to implement the memorandum?
8. Please explain the significance of a threat tag and how threat tags are used by the FBI?
9. Has any other component of the department created a threat tag or similar label for parents who attend school board or other public meetings?
10. How many parents have had a threat tag or other label assigned to them after attending a school board or other public meeting?
11. Please provide copies of all follow-up memorandum, guidance, or other materials created by department personnel to implement your memorandum.
12. Please provide copies of all materials shared by department personnel with federal, state, local, Tribal, and territorial leaders regarding parental participation in school board or other public meetings.
13. Is the department or any component of the department working with federal, state, local, Tribal, and territorial leaders to compile lists of parents who attend school board or other public meetings?

14. Are FBI agents, other department personnel, or other department assets attending school board or other public meetings to monitor parents?
15. Are department resources being used to run background checks or conduct other research on parents who attend school board or other public meetings?
