Dear Secretary Haaland, Secretary Blinken, and Commissioner Touton,

The ongoing Colorado River drought situation necessitates action by the federal government to assist in identifying new long-term sources of water to meet the needs of Lower Basin states. Arizona has long been a partner with the Basin States and the federal government to manage this critical resource and desires to continue to be partner with the federal government in augmenting Colorado River supplies.

Earlier this year, Arizona approved a \$1 billion investment for water augmentation projects. These recent actions demonstrate Arizona's commitment to invest in water supply projects that support the State's growing population and to confront the serious conditions on the Colorado River.

While the fund does not commit the state to any specific projects, one project under consideration would require a binational agreement between the United States and Mexico to support desalination efforts in the Gulf of California. According to a study undertaken by the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation in 2012, desalination in the Gulf of California has a potential yield of 200,000 acre feet of water per year<sup>1</sup>. That water could be transported to the United States by pipeline or exchanged for a share of Mexico's Colorado River allotment. Arizona is prepared to discuss this effort in more detail but needs the assistance of the federal government to bring representatives from Mexico to the table.

Engagement with Mexico is vital to explore opportunities for augmentation and to address the serious drought situation on the Colorado River.
